WHO-recommended handrubs: production in 11 pilot sites

- Production at hospital level in 7/11
- Production volumes: 10-600,000 litres/month
- Cost: US\$ 0.30-0.50 per 100 ml
- · Optimal quality control results in all sites
- Stability at tropical temperatures (up to 19 months)
- Optimal tolerability and acceptability by HCWs
- Scale-up to national production in 5 sites
